Hook: 10-20 Light Wire, dry fly
Thread: 8/0 black
Tail: Brown and grizzly hackle fibers
Body: Gray muskrat underfur
Wings: Grizzly hen hackle tips
Hackle: Brown and grizzly hackle, mixed

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in mixed brown and grizzly hackle tips.
- Dub muskrat underfur on to thread and wrap 3/4 the way up the hook shank, with a taper.
- Tie in 2 grizzly hackle tips, standing straight up in a V.
- Tie in a brown and a grizzly hackle by their tips in front of the dubbing and wrap forward, and around the wings.
- Secure with thread, trim, and whip finish.





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Blue Wing Olive



Hook: TMC 100 12-20
Thread: 8/0 Olive
Tail: Blue dun hackle fibers
Body: Medium olive rabbit dubbing
Wing: Blue dun hackle fibers
Hackle: Blue dun

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in blue dun hackle fibers at bend of hook for tail. Trim butts and wrap thread up about 3/4 the way up the hook shank.
- Tie in 2 blue dun hen hackle tips facing straight up for wing. Wing should be about the same length as the body.
- Wrap thread back to bend of hook and spin on dubbing. Wrap dubbing forward just over half way up the hook shank. Body should get slightly thicker towards eye of hook.
- Tie in 2 blue dun hackles by their tips and wrap each each hackle separately forward to the eye of the hook, be careful not to wrap over the wings.
- Secure hackles at eye of hook and trim excess.
- Whip finish and head cement.





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Delta Nymph



Hook: 12- 6 nymph
Thread: 6/0 Black
Tail: 3 brown goose biots
Body: Rabbit dubbing with angel hair shavings mixed in
Ribbing: Brown larva lace
Shellback: Pheasant tail fibers
Thorax: same as body

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in a brown goose biot out each side at bend of hook. Then tie in one more straight out the back between the other two goose biots.
- Tie in larva lace and let it hang back over tail.
- Spin dubbing on to thread and wrap forward 3/4 the way up the hook shank, getting slightly thicker towards the eye.
- Wrap larva lace forward, with about 3 or 4 wraps, depending on the size of the nymph. Secure with thread at end of the body.
- Tie in pheasant tail fibers with tips extending back over body.
- Spin more dubbing on to thread and wrap forward to eye of the hook. Make sure that the thorax is thicker than the body.
- Pull pheasant tail fibers forward over the thorax and secure with thread and trim at eye of the hook.
- Whip finish and head cement.
- Use a bodkin to pull out fibers from the thorax to form legs.





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Fullback



Hook: 14-8 nymph
Thread: 8/0 Black
Tail: Pheasant rump
Body: Peacock herl
Wingcase: Pheasant rump
Legs: Pheasant rump

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in pheasant rump at bend of hook for tail. Tail should be at least half the length of body.
- Tie in pheasant rump with tips extending back over tail for the wingcase. Tips of the wingcase will be used to form legs so measure before hand.
- Tie in peacock herl and wrap forward and tie off with thread just before the eye of the hook.
- Pull pheasant rump forward for wingcase and secure with thread.
- Pull pheasant rump down and back, and secure in position with several wraps of thread.
- Whip finish, and head cement.





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Half Back



Hook: 14-8 Nymph
Thread: 8/0 Black
Tail: Pheasant rump
Body: Peacock herl
Wingcase: Pheasant rump
Thorax: Peacock herl
Legs: Pheasant rump

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in a few pheasant rump tips at bend of hook for tail.
- Tie in 2 strands of peacock herl and wrap forward 3/4 the way up the hook shank. Body should be tapered, towards eye of hook. Secure with thread and trim
- Tie in pheasant rump for wingcase, with tips extending back over body.
- Tie in another 2 or 3 strands of peacock herl and wrap forward to eye of hook, making the thorax thicker than the abdomen.
- Tie in a few more tips of pheasant rump with tips extending underneath as legs.
- Pull pheasant rump for wingcase forward over thorax and secure with thread.
- Trim, whip finish, and head cement.





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Hares Ear Nymph



Hook: 16-10 Nymph

Thread: Tan 8/0

Tail: Hare's mask guard hairs, or brown hackle fibers

Rib: Fine oval gold tinsel

Body: Hare's mask dubbing, thorax thicker than abdomen.

Wingcase: Mottled turkey or Pheasant Tail

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in 10 to 15 hare's mask fibers at the bend of hook for the tail and trim off excess butts.
- Next, tie in oval gold tinsel.
- Apply hare's mask dubbing on to thread, by spinning it between your forefinger and thumb.
- Wind the dubbed thread forward, just past the middle of the shank of the hook.
- Next, wrap the oval wire ribbing over the dubbed body.
- Tie in Turkey quill with tip facing the hook bend. Make sure to put the shiny side of the quill facing up.
- Dub hare's mask dubbing on to your thread (thicker than the abdomen) and wrap it on to hook. Leave a small space between dubbing and the eye of your hook, to tie in your wingcase.
- Pull Turkey quill forward, over the hare's mask dubbing and secure with thread.
- Trim turkey quill, and whip finish.
- Using a bodkin, pull out some of the dubbing, under the wingcase for legs.





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Lighting Bug

Hook: 16 to 10 Tiemco 2302

Thread: 8/0 Black

Tail: Pheasant tail

Body: Pearl, medium, flat mylar wrap

Rib: Copper wire

Wingcase: Same as body

Thorax: Peacock herl

Legs: Pheasant tail

Head: 1/8 Gold Bead (optional)

Tying Instructions:

- Slide gold bead on to hook and make several wraps of thread behind bead to secure bead in place.
- Wrap thread to bend of hook and tie in several pheasant tail fibers, and trim the butts.
- Tie in mylar tinsel and copper wire.
- Wrap mylar forward along shank, half way up the hook shank and secure in place with thread.
- Wrap copper wire over body and secure with thread and trim.
- Tie in another piece of mylar on top, back over the body.
- Tie in 2 pieces of peacock herl and wrap forward to just before the bead.
- Tie in several pheasant tail fibers out either side of the thorax.
- Pull mylar forward over peacock herl and legs. Secure with thread and trim.
- Whip finish and head cement.





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Olive Adams

Hook: 10-20 Light Wire, dry fly
Thread: 8/0 Black
Tail: Brown and grizzly hackle fibers
Body: Olive dry fly dubbing
Wings: Grizzly hen hackle tips
Hackle: Brown and grizzly hackle, mixed

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in mixed brown and grizzly hackle tips.
- Dub olive dubbing on to thread and wrap 3/4 the way up the hook shank, with a taper.
- Tie in 2 grizzly hackle tips, standing straight up in a V.
- Tie in a brown and a grizzly hackle by their tips in front of the dubbing and wrap forward, and around the wings.
- Secure with thread, trim, and whip finish.





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Pheasant Tail Nymph



Hook: 16-8 Nymph
Thread: 8/0 Black or Brown
Tail: Several Pheasant Tail Fibers
Body: Pheasant Tail Fibers
Rib: Fine or Medium Copper Wire
Thorax: Peacock Herl.
Wings: Pheasant Tail Fibers
Wingcase: Pheasant Tail Fibers

Tying Instructions:

- Get a Pheasant tail handy, because you'll need a lot of it for this fly.
- Tie in several fibers of pheasant tail at the beginning of the hook for tail. Tail should be approximately half the length of the hook shank.
- Tie in pheasant tail for body, with tips extended back over tail.
- Tie in your copper ribbing, and then wrap the pheasant tail forward, just past the half way point of the hook shank.
- Next wrap the copper ribbing forward over the pheasant tail body.
- Tie in more pheasant tail for the wingcase, with tips extending back over body.
- Tie in 2 or 3 strands of peacock herl for thorax and wrap forward, leaving enough room to tie in wings and wingcase.
- Tie in several pheasant tail fibers on either side for wings. Tips should extend to end of thorax.
- Pull wingcase forward and tie off, and whip finish.





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Skip Nymph



Hook: 14-10 Nymph
Thread: 6/0 Black
Tail: Pheasant tail fibers
Body: Rabbit antron dubbing
Ribbing: Copper wire
Shellback: Pheasant tail fibers
Thorax: Rabbit antron dubbing well picked out.

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in pheasant tail fibers at bend of hook with several wraps of thread, and then pull butts back over tail and secure back with several more wraps of thread.
- Tie in copper wire ribbing.
- Dub antron dubbing on to thread and wrap forward about 3/4 the way up the hook shank.
- Pull pheasant tail over body and secure with thread, do not trim butts, they will be used for wingcase.
- Wrap copper wire over shellback and body and secure with thread and trim.
- Pull the pheasant tail butts back and secure back with several wraps of thread.
- Dub a generous amount of antron dubbing on to thread and wrap forward to eye. Make thorax thicker than abdomen.
- Pull pheasant tail butts over thorax and secure with thread.
- Trim, whip finish, and head cement.





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Super Nymph

Hook: 12-8 Mustad 9672
Thread: 8/0 Black
Tail: Pheasant tail
Body: Pheasant tail wrapped
Rib: Medium copper wire
Wingcase: Pheasant tail
Thorax: Brown dubbing
Hackle: Brown saddle

Tying Instructions:

- Tie in pheasant tail for tail. Tail should be long, at least 3/4 length of body.
- Tie in more pheasant for body, with tips extending back.
- Tie in copper wire.
- Wrap pheasant tail for body forward about 1/2 to 3/4 the way up the hook shank with a slight taper.
- Tie in pheasant tail for wingcase, with tips extending back over body.
- Tie in 2 brown saddle hackles by their tips.
- Dub brown dubbing on to thread and wrap forward to just before eye of hook.
- Palmer hackle over the dubbing and stroke the hackle fibers back as you wrap.
- Pull wingcase over body and hackle and secure with thread.
- Whip finish and head cement.
